This is the first cohort study in Vietnam to assess the impact of intimate partner violence during pregnancy, following women from childbirth to 12 months postpartum, thereby enabling comprehensive observation and analysis of the multidimensional effects of violence on maternal health and infant development over time.

2. The study makes an important contribution to medical practice and community health by raising awareness of intimate partner violence during pregnancy, supporting the development of effective intervention programs, and providing an evidence base for education, counseling, and comprehensive healthcare for women and children.

3. The study has international significance, providing scientific evidence and empirical data for low- and middle-income countries, supporting policy development for the prevention of intimate partner violence and the improvement of quality of life for women and children, particularly in relation to child health during the first 1,000 days of life—a critical period for optimal human development.
